I was glad to have the chance to speak with you today, but very disappointed to learn that [CHURCH NAME] is following along with current trends in feminizing the congregation through having women teach over men. These actions have real consequences, and for me those consequences mean not being able to participate and having to look elsewhere. The current feminization of the church is a terrible and divisive trend. I hope you are willing to consider that this may not be the right course. It seems foolish of us to think that we will transform the world around us, when we are behaving much like the world ourselves.

Yes, I am very, very sorry. It leaves me in a state of grief. But what you are doing is divisive, and I will not expose my immediate family to that example. Please reconsider what you have done, and restore the rightful roles of men.
